To achieve this mission, the Law Center engages in impact litigation, conducts policy advocacy, and engages in public education. The Law Center's areas of legal concentration include opposing the criminalization of homelessness, promoting homeless people's access to housing and public benefits, advocating for the housing rights of victims of domestic violence, enforcing homeless children's education rights, and utilizing international human rights law as a tool for eliminating homelessness.
