An example are the special homeless outreach teams composed of police officers and CoC member staff which were created. Protocols and practices were developed for locating homeless individuals and engaging with them in order to make effective connections between the individual and the services/housing needed. The purpose of this teaming is to give police officers a larger "toolbox" of alternative responses for handling difficult situations with homeless individuals; alternatives to harassment/arrest/incarceration. Establishing a different model for police officer engagement with the homeless serves to educate the local public by demonstrating there are more effective ways to solve homelessness issues. // Data-Driven decision making using CoC data from HMIS/Coordinated Entry // CoC collaboration w/ Fresno's Homeless Court: Fresno's Homeless Court, a joint venture of the Superior Court, the District Attorney's office, Public Defender and Sheriff and members of CoC treatment programs. Participants are referred to Homeless Court by FMCOC members and related agencies, including Poverello House, Fresno Rescue Mission, West Care, Spirit of Women, Salvation Army and Paths and Maroa Home. The court convenes 3-4 times a year and improves access to justice for the homeless population, who typically will not appear for court in a traditional courthouse setting. By addressing their outstanding criminal cases, barriers to employment and governmental services are removed. This also eases the court docket and saves jail costs by imposing community service or giving credit for time served in alcohol and drug treatment programs in lieu of incarceration or fines defendants are not able to pay. Most sentences are served as community service for agencies who serve the homeless. Common cases involve traffic matters, public intoxication, petty theft, trespass, drinking in public, urinating in public and panhandling. Again, this model is an integral part of a path out of homelessness for affected individuals, as well as providing education to the public and service to the larger community.

Due to the education and engagement by LAHSA, homeless housing and service providers, homeless/formerly homeless individuals, and other stakeholders, the City Council placed the ordinance on hold and did not implement pending amendment. LAHSA and other CoC members worked with the City of LA to amend language and omit the penalties associated with this ordinance, as well as looking to ensure that a study be done regarding gaps in storage and public lavatories throughout the City. As a result of these efforts, on Nov 17, 2015, the LA City Council amended the ordinance to remove sanctions and criminal penalties, reducing sanction further than the initial municipal code. LAHSA has also met with the LA county Board of Supervisors, the regional convening of LA County Mayors, and numerous legislative, municipal legal staff and criminal justice policy makers to educate them on the need to prevent criminalization and remove legal staff and criminal justice policy makers to educate them on the need to prevent Emergency Response Teams outreach efforts with the Healthy Street Project in collaboration with the LA city, Dept. of Sanitation, Bureau of Public Works and LAPD to ensure homeless people are properly notified of street cleaning schedules and to conduct outreach to homeless individuals/families in encampments. These efforts seek to ensure connection to services and housing, and to prevent escalation of encounters with other public services that can lead to arrest. LAHSA is also leading the LA County Homeless Outreach Assessment Project to assess all current outreach teams, services, and geographic reach to document all gaps and make recommendations better coordination for the LA CoC.

The Collaborative Applicant chairs the CIT Homelessness Subcommittee. The CIT model is directed locally by CoC HMIS Lead Kern County Mental Health. "CIT International is a non-profit membership organization whose primary purpose is to facilitate understanding, development and implementation of CIT programs worldwide to promote and support collaborative efforts to create and sustain more effective interactions among law enforcement, mental health care providers, individuals with mental illness, their families and communities and to reduce the stigma of mental illness. CIT works to raise public and stakeholder awareness through education and outreach, establish and disseminate recommended standards for developing, implementing and sustaining crisis intervention programs, providing assistance to communities." // A Coordinated Entry and Assessment (CEA) Plan incorporates a Quick Referral Tool (QRT) to empower community partners with access to CoC's members and services. The CEA Committee determined the QRT should include training for community partners including parole, probation, family unification programs, health plans and hospitals. The Collaborative Applicant presents countywide on the myths of homelessness and the United Nations finding relating to criminalizing homelessness; resulting in increased empathy, encourages redirecting individuals, and discourages criminalizing homelessness. The CoC's Governance Charter specifies that all members serve those who are homeless or at risk, regardless of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, familial status, or disability. // The County of Kern is the third largest county in California covering an expanse of 1,861 sq. miles of agricultural land, desert, mountains, waterways, and oilfields. All efforts - in outreach, service, and PIT counts - are exhausted to reach every rural unincorporated and incorporated areas. In the county seat of Bakersfield the city's Police Department developed a specialized foot beat officer force that works with service providers. The effort has directly assisted with housing those most chronically homeless by avoiding arrest for these individuals who are connected to services. 20% of the 573 unsheltered individuals contacted through ESG funded street outreach have been housed.

The ACC Police Department was awarded a U.S. Department of Justice grant called the Justice & Mental Health Collaboration Program grant to facilitate collaboration with local law enforcement, homeless service providers, corrections, courts, area hospitals, mental health providers, and local emergency transport staff with the ultimate goal to divert individuals with mental health and co-occurring substance abuse issues from jail to appropriate mental health treatment providers. ACC's largest homeless/mental health/substance abuse treatment provider, Advantage Behavioral Health Systems, is a major participant in this grant. Mental illness and substance abuse are the main causes of homelessness. The collaboration of the courts, law enforcement, corrections, courts and homeless service providers will further the goal of eliminating homelessness and reducing any resulting criminal activity by this population.

We have involved local law enforcement and judicial officials in its efforts to develop diversion programs as alternatives to incarceration for minor crimes, and have prioritized further examination of local ordinances to ensure that they are not criminalizing or exacerbating homelessness. Many CoC organizations work closely with law enforcement and have law enforcement officials, such as police, parole and probation officers as board members to help educate law enforcement of homeless concerns and issues. Law enforcement also participates in Crisis Intervention Training and Mental Health First Aid to understand mental health issues. Intensive case management is also employed to reduce recidivism among justice-involved and formerly justice involved individuals and increase medical and mental health service access. Continued efforts between HAP and law enforcement help prevent disputes from escalating to criminal matters between homeless and landlords. Local jurisdictions wrestle with possible conflicts between community safety and criminalization of homelessness. For example, trespassing, loitering, and remaining in parks after closing commonly represent violations of municipal ordinances. These circumstances necessitate involvement of stakeholders from varied sectors, such as mainstream providers, businesses, policymakers, and homeless individuals. These efforts require considerable time and energy, but this has not prevented them from pursuing sustainable resolutions with the aforementioned stakeholders.

An attorney represented those cited for violating the ordinance on a pro bono basis. After processing numerous citations in the first few months after the revised ordinance's passage, few, if any, citations have been issued in the last 18 months.

Rather than face arrest or forcible removal, the outreach teams now have an office in the bus station to engage clients. The Transit Police are now active participants in the Outreach Committee. The Outreach Teams are working closely with the Buffalo Police on a Quality of Life detail to help reduce business complaints regarding homeless clients in the downtown areas. Local homeless advocates have been protesting the criminalization of homelessness for several years. The CoC board's strategy resulted in CoC representatives meeting with officials from Springfield and Lane County and receiving written responses from all jurisdictions. Advocates had concerns with these types of responses: "Springfield prohibits camping in public; the City of Eugene reports 'no laws that makes being homeless a criminal activity.' Lane County reports no ordinances or policies that prohibit any person from engaging in 'life sustaining activities...no Lane Code prohibitions against activities such as: eating, sleeping, resting or urination and dedication.' Homeless advocates responded that these jurisdictional responses demonstrate only an early stage understanding of what it means to decriminalize homelessness." In spite of the jurisdictional responses to the criminalization question, advocates point out that laws about camping/sleeping with bedding are enforced on publicly-owned and private property, using camping or trespass laws in both towns' city limits. They note that unhoused community members are vulnerable to citation or arrest for sleeping in public when using no more than a blanket or small tarp. The Eugene Human Rights Commission is planning a December 9, 2015 joint work session with the City Council on alternatives to criminalization. The CoC is supporting advocates' efforts to increase private and public collaborations. These have resulted in some outdoor shelter including "car camping" and privately funded tent villages. These temporary sites provide sanctioned camping areas for a small number of the total unhoused. Increasing permanent supportive housing units is a current CoC board strategy.

Rapid City has involved local law enforcement and judicial officials in its efforts to develop diversion programs as alternatives to incarceration for minor crimes, and both Rapid City and Sioux Falls have prioritized further examination of local ordinances to ensure that they are not criminalizing or exacerbating homelessness. Law enforcement also participates in Crisis Intervention Training and Mental Health First Aid to understand mental health issues. Intensive case management and coordinated assessment reentry (CART) is also employed to reduce recidivism among justice-involved and formerly justice-involved individuals and increase medical and mental health service access. SDHDA currently retains a Fair Housing Ombudsman to assist with landlord-tenant issues and fair housing discrimination claims. In addition, our ombudsman held educational outreach to inform the public of the services he offers, common fair housing issues, and possible resolutions. These efforts help prevent disputes from escalating to criminal matters. Local jurisdictions wrestle with possible conflicts between community safety and criminalization of homelessness. For example, trespassing, loitering, and remaining in parks after closing commonly represent violations of municipal ordinances. These circumstances necessitate involvement of stakeholders from varied sectors, such as mainstream providers, businesses, policymakers, and homeless individuals. SDHHC members appreciate that these efforts require considerable time and energy, but this has not prevented them from pursuing sustainable resolutions with the aforementioned stakeholders. As we realize success with these local efforts, we can share data with other communities and mobilize a broader coalition to advance enactment of similar initiatives statewide

This innovative program helps bring a voice to Atlanta's homeless residents that become entangled with the criminal system. When unlawful activity results in arrest, the Public Defender's Office is the first responder. Every client in the Atlanta Detention Center is seen by the Public Defender's Office within just hours of their arrest. An interdisciplinary team of attorneys, investigators and client advocates gather early every morning in the holding facility of the Municipal Court to begin the important work of restoring lives. Each member of the team works to provide not only legal defense services, but also connections to social services that enhance the quality of life, health and safety of the client and the community where they live. Every client that has been arrested yesterday receives legal advice and holistic care from the Public Defender's Office today. A team of social workers and trained advocates target the personal needs of each client; addressing homelessness, mental illness, drug addiction, identification cards, unemployment and educational needs. Each member of the team specializes in one of these areas and leads the work of connecting each client to services available in the Atlanta community. The holistic care team works quickly to identify needs and link clients to services, with the goal of securing release from incarceration as immediately as possible. Each homeless client receives a VI-SPDAT and is registered in Pathways. Additionally, internal data is collected for every service referral made through the Public Defender's Office. This work enhances the ability to keep clients connected to care and is a top priority for the Atlanta CoC..

With the restructuring of our CoC Board, the San Antonio Chief of Police and the Bexar County Sheriff both have standing positions.
